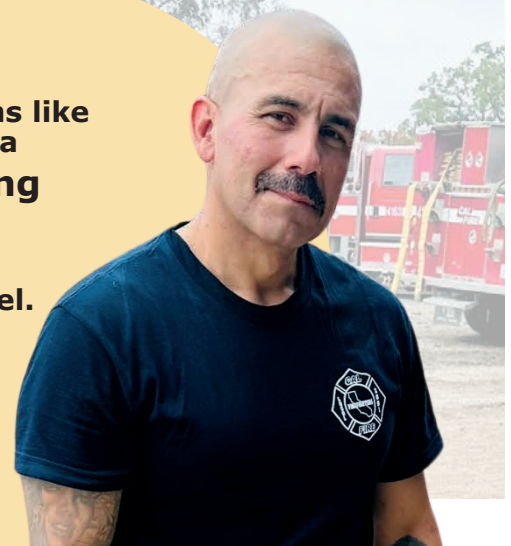
SAFEKEEPING

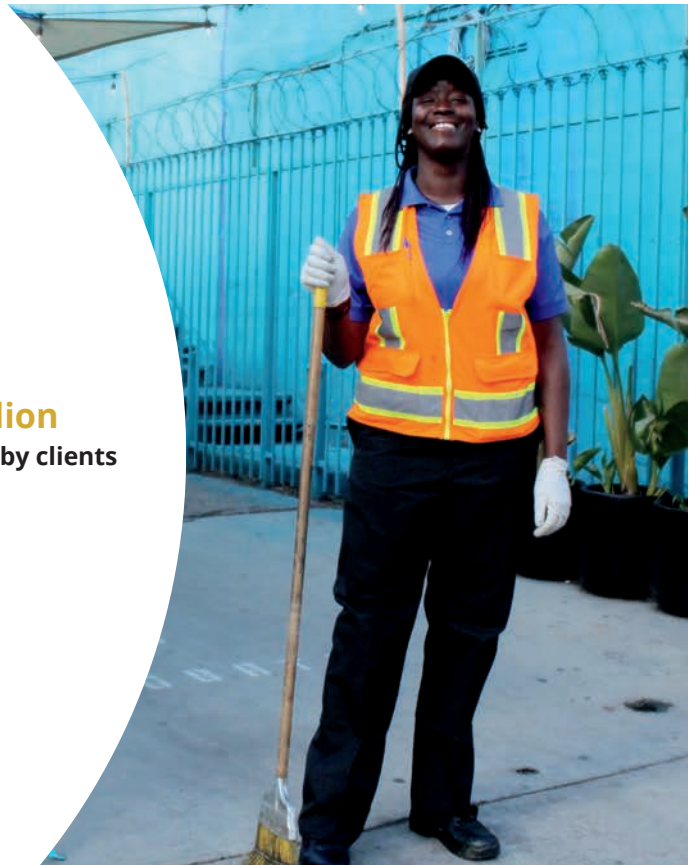
